**Higher Water Levels Anticipated on Otonabee River**

The City of Peterborough is expecting increased water flows and water levels along the Otonabee River today. The Otonabee Region Conservation Authority has advised that the major area in the city to be affected will be Little Lake including Little Lake Marina and Holiday Inn.

Staff are monitoring the situation and will be taking appropriate action as required.

The City of Peterborough continues to experience large flows at our Sewage Treatment Plant. Residents are asked to conserve water to help reduce the flows at the Sewage Treatment Plant.

At this point in time, there are no homes experiencing flooding. However, City residents living in low lying areas along the Otonabee River are encouraged to monitor water level changes on their properties, and to take necessary precautions to protect life and property.
