### **Veterans' Wall of Honour Dedication Ceremony**

The official Veterans' Wall of Honour Dedication Ceremony will take place this Saturday, October 9, 2010 at 2:00 p.m. in Confederation Square. All are welcome to attend this momentous occasion. Following the ceremony, all are welcome to attend a reception in the Armoury.

Major General Rohmer has been invited to share the reviewing stand with honoured members of the Veterans' Wall of Honour Committee, who have worked for many years to complete this project. Members include: George Squance and Jack Oakley from the Naval Association; Robert Hull and Frank Mancini from the Air Force; and John Turner and Bill Cridland from the Royal Canadian Legion.

Veterans are encouraged to wear their medals and family members of veterans are encouraged to identify themselves by wearing a white ribbon on their left lapel.

Temporary road closures from 12:00 p.m. to 4:30 pm for this event include:

- **McDonnell Street** – from the east curb line of Aylmer Street to the west curb line of Water Street
- **George Street North** – from the south curb line of Parkhill Road to the North curb line of Brock Street
- **Murray Street** – from the east curb line of Aylmer Street to the west curb line of Water Street

Parking for **Veterans only** will be available on a first-come-first-served basis in the City Hall parking lot on the east side of the building, and in the PCVS parking lot.

The drop off location for **Veterans only** is on Murray Street by the Armoury.

**There will be no parking at the Armoury.**

Parking for the public will be available in the Brock Street parking lot on a first-come-first-served basis or in other municipal lots in the downtown area.

The award-winning monument builders, Martel & Sons Inc., completed the installation of the twelve granite blocks upon which the engraved names of more than 11,000 men and women who served in World War I, World War II and the Korean War are displayed on black polished granite panels. Much of the planned work to the park has also been completed, including new interlocked pathways and plantings, finalizing the vision of landscape architect Brian Basterfield.
