



Fast Facts for Voters: 2022 Municipal Election

Dates

- **Voting Day:** Monday, October 24, 2022, 10 a.m. to 8 p.m.
- **Advance Voting and Accessible Voting Opportunities at select locations:** Saturday October 8, 15 and 22, 2022, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- **Accessible Voting at City Hall:** October 17 to 21, 2022, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Are you on the Voter's List?

The Voters' List is a list of the people living in a municipality who are eligible to vote. It is every resident's right to vote in the municipality where you own property.

Visit voterlookup.ca to make sure you are on the list, confirm that your information is accurate and update any information that may not be current.

Eligible voters whose names are on the list will receive a Voter Notification Card in the mail in late September or early October. This card will let you know where to vote on October 24. Be sure to bring it with you when you go to vote, whether you're voting at an Advance Poll location or on Voting Day.

What do I bring to vote?

Your Voter Notification Card and Identification (ID) is required when you vote. You will need to show ID which contains your name and address. You may have to show two pieces of ID to accomplish this.

Please bring an original, or certified/notarized copy of acceptable identification. A full list of acceptable identification is available on the [municipal election web page](#).

The most common types of ID are any of the following documents:

- Ontario driver's licence
 - Ontario Health Card (photo card)
 - Ontario Photo Card
 - mortgage statement, lease or rental agreement relating to property in Ontario
 - insurance policy or insurance statement
 - any document from a Band Council in Ontario established under the Indian Act (Canada)
 - income tax assessment notice
 - any other document from the government of Canada, Ontario or a municipality in Ontario or from an agency or such a government
 - property tax assessment
 - utility bill for hydro, water, gas, telephone or cable TV or a bill from a public utilities commission
 - transcript or report card from a post-secondary school

Who can vote?

In order to be eligible to vote, you must meet the Qualifications of Electors as listed in the [Municipal Elections Act, 1996, s.17\(2\)](#)

A person is entitled to be an elector at an election held in a local municipality if, on voting day, he or she,

- resides in the local municipality or is the owner or tenant of land there, or is the spouse of such owner or tenant;
- is a Canadian citizen;
- is at least 18 years old; and
- is not prohibited from voting under subsection (3) or otherwise by law.

Are Students eligible to vote?

Students are allowed to vote in both their home municipality and the municipality where they are attending school.

Where do I vote?

Eligible electors whose name is on the Voter's list will receive a Voter Notification Card (VNC) in the mail in late September or early October telling them where they may vote. All voters must vote at a voting location within their Ward. The VNC will direct voters to the closest poll location to them.
