## Education



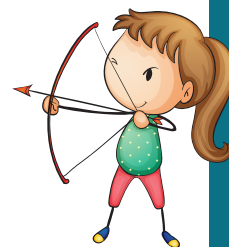
Are instruction, schooling, and training from birth to adulthood available? Accessible? Do they prepare people for work, life and life's changes?

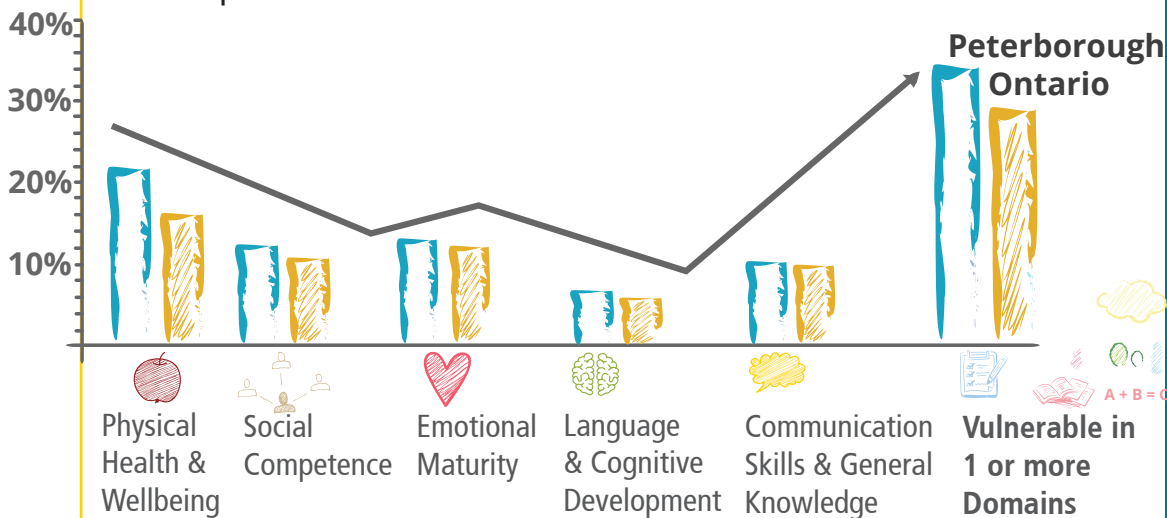

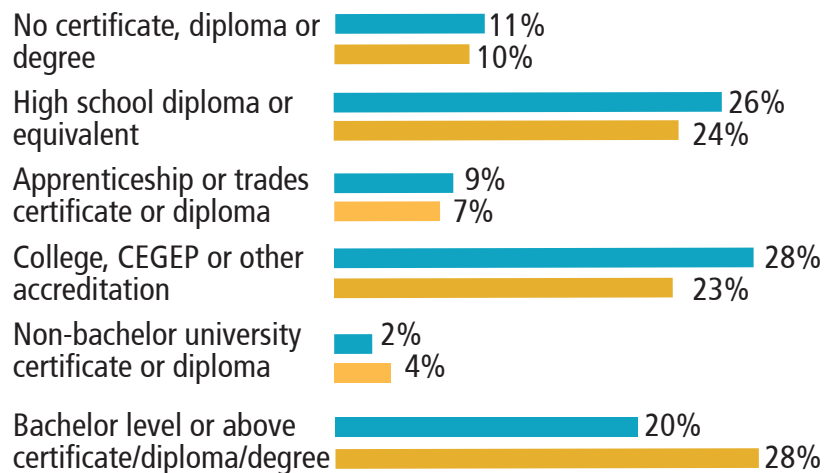
