#### 1. **Review and Approval of Minutes From December 2017 and March 2018:**

- Minutes from December 14, 2017 meeting approved as written/circulated. (Moved by Trish Terryberry, and seconded by Connie Hodson →**carried**)
- Minutes from March 2018 meeting amended to Notes, updated and filed as notes.

#### 2. **Airport Operations updates:**

- Flying Colours is expected to begin construction this summer on the area east of Airport Road.
- Update on the Air Event in July and August: The B25 Mitchell bomber will arrive July 23<sup>rd</sup> and will be giving flights on the weekend of July 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>. They depart on Monday July 30<sup>th</sup>. The B29 Superfortress will arrive on July 30<sup>th</sup> and will be giving flights on the weekend of August 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>. They will depart August 6<sup>th</sup>.
- The weekend of August 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> we will be hosting an air event called Air Legends at Peterborough Airport, which will include a static display of

aircraft, vintage cars and motorcycles, with the proceeds of the event going to Brock Mission shelter for men in Peterborough.

### 3. Quarterly Noise Complaint Summary:

- 1074 noise complaints were registered from March 1<sup>st</sup> to May 31<sup>st</sup>. The complaints were generated by an average of 2.63 households. 62% were generated with night flying and 38% during day flights.
- Going forward, we will be including the total number of households generating the complaints.

### 4. Follow Up on Deferred Motions Passed in March 2017 & September 2017:

**Motion: All parties bring forward all and any options that may facilitate a reduction in noise (level and frequency and duration) that is disruptive to area residents so that PANLG may review, discuss, and determine effective options to be considered at our next meeting.**

It was suggested that this motion change to an agenda item for meetings going forward.

**Decision: VOTE → CARRIED**

**Motion: To bring ideas to survey and solicit productive feedback from area stakeholders re: circuit changes and noise abatement for an anonymous survey.**

The Peterborough Airport will be hosting an open house, inviting all the residents in the identified noise exposure areas when the new Noise Exposure Forecast is completed. Our plan is to host open houses on a regular basis.

**5. New Business:**

- There have been no applications received for PANLG members, or for alternate members. The positions continue to be advertised on the airport's website and had been advertised in the local newspapers.
- We are in the process of getting a resident number count specifically for the identified noise sensitive areas and will have this available for our next meeting.
- There will be a 72 hour limit put on filing noise complaints, and this will be posted on the website. All noise complaints are logged; however, in order for the noise complaint to be researched, analyzed and verified, they must be submitted within 72 hours of the event.
- There will be a conduct advisory added to the noise abatement web page that complaints or communications involving threats or offensive language will not be responded to.
- We are amending the first quarter meeting to Thursday February 21<sup>st</sup>, 2019, so it would not interfere with the March break going forward.
