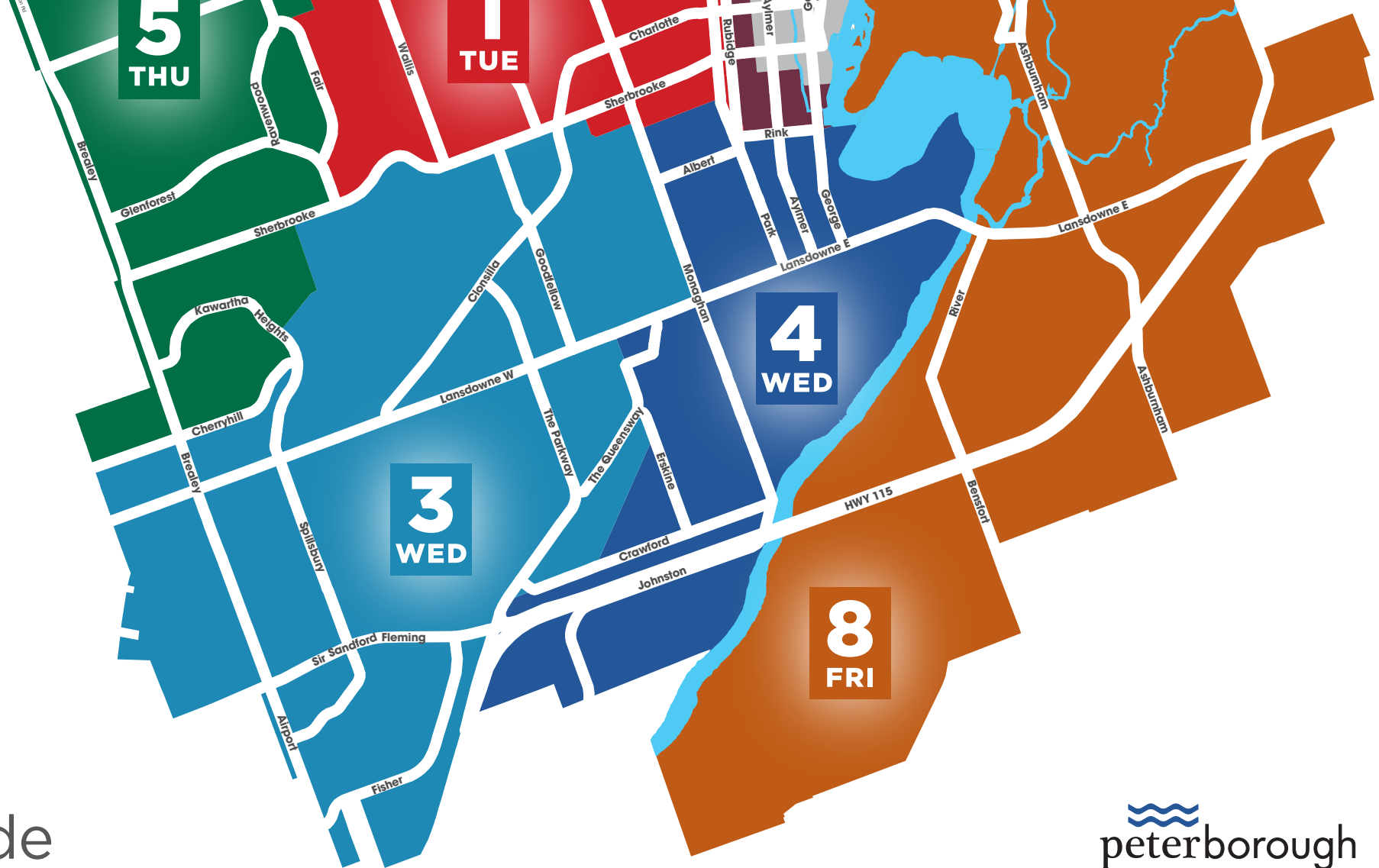

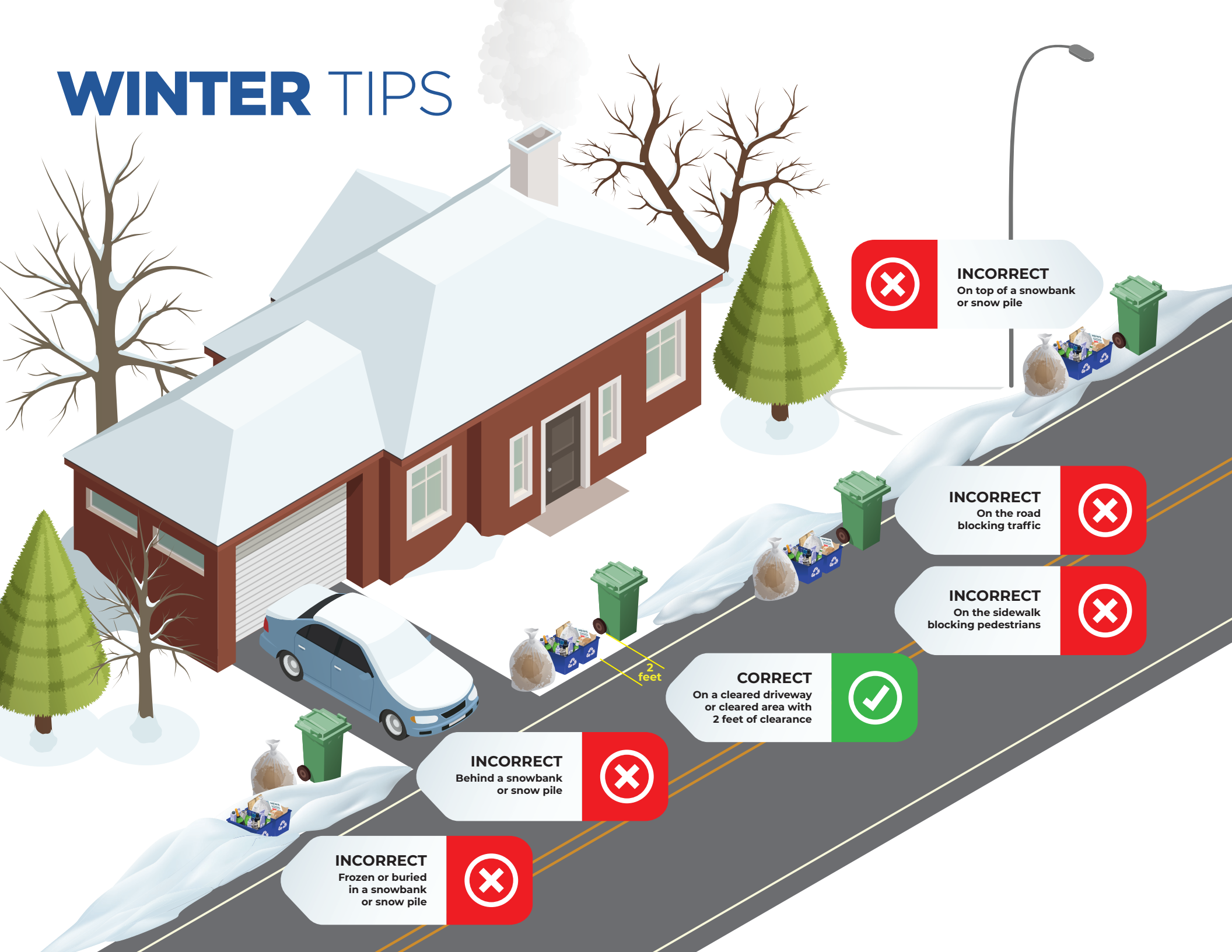

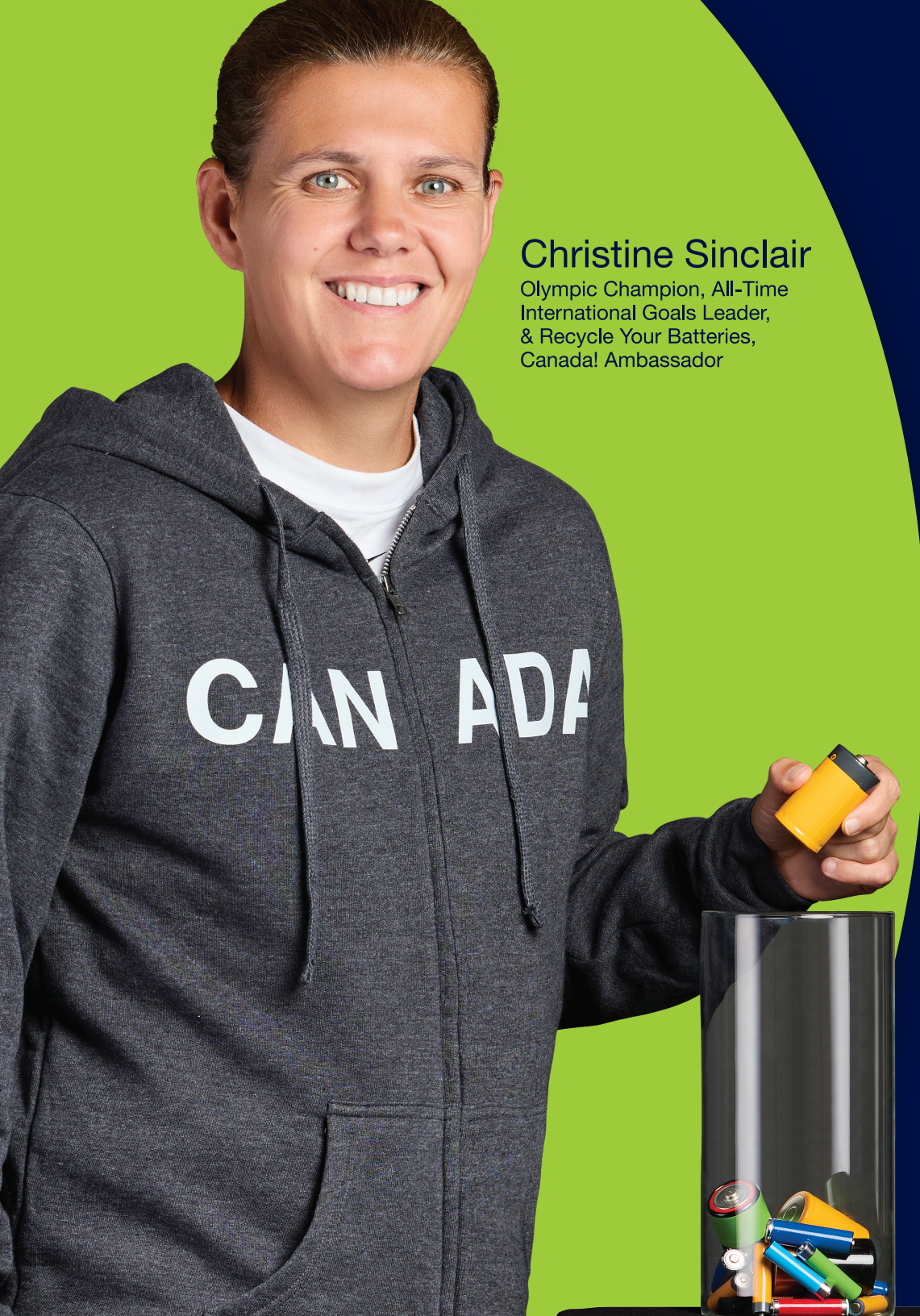

Your Help is Appreciated

Waste collection can be more difficult during winter months. Placing green bins, garbage, or blue boxes on top of icy snow piles or behind snowbanks makes waste collection unsafe for workers. Please place materials at the end of your driveway, or shovel a small ledge in the snowbank to set it on.



CURB TO COMPOST

The Yard Waste Journey

After collection, leaf and yard waste heads to the Peterborough Organics Facility on Bensfort Road where it's blended with organic materials from green bins. This mix balances carbon from leaves and nitrogen from food waste, creating the perfect environment for composting.

The mixture is then placed in concrete bunkers with GORE® covers, which help maintain the right temperature and moisture for aerobic digestion, effectively killing off harmful bacteria and pathogens.

After about six weeks, the volume decreases by roughly 25%, and the material is transferred to open windrows for an additional four to six weeks of curing.

Once cured, the compost is screened to remove contaminants like plastic and glass, so it's crucial to avoid putting non-organic items such as containers, wrappers, packaging, or bags in your yard waste or green bin.

Finally, the nutrient-rich compost is tested for quality and is ready to begin its cycle again.

Organize a community cleanup

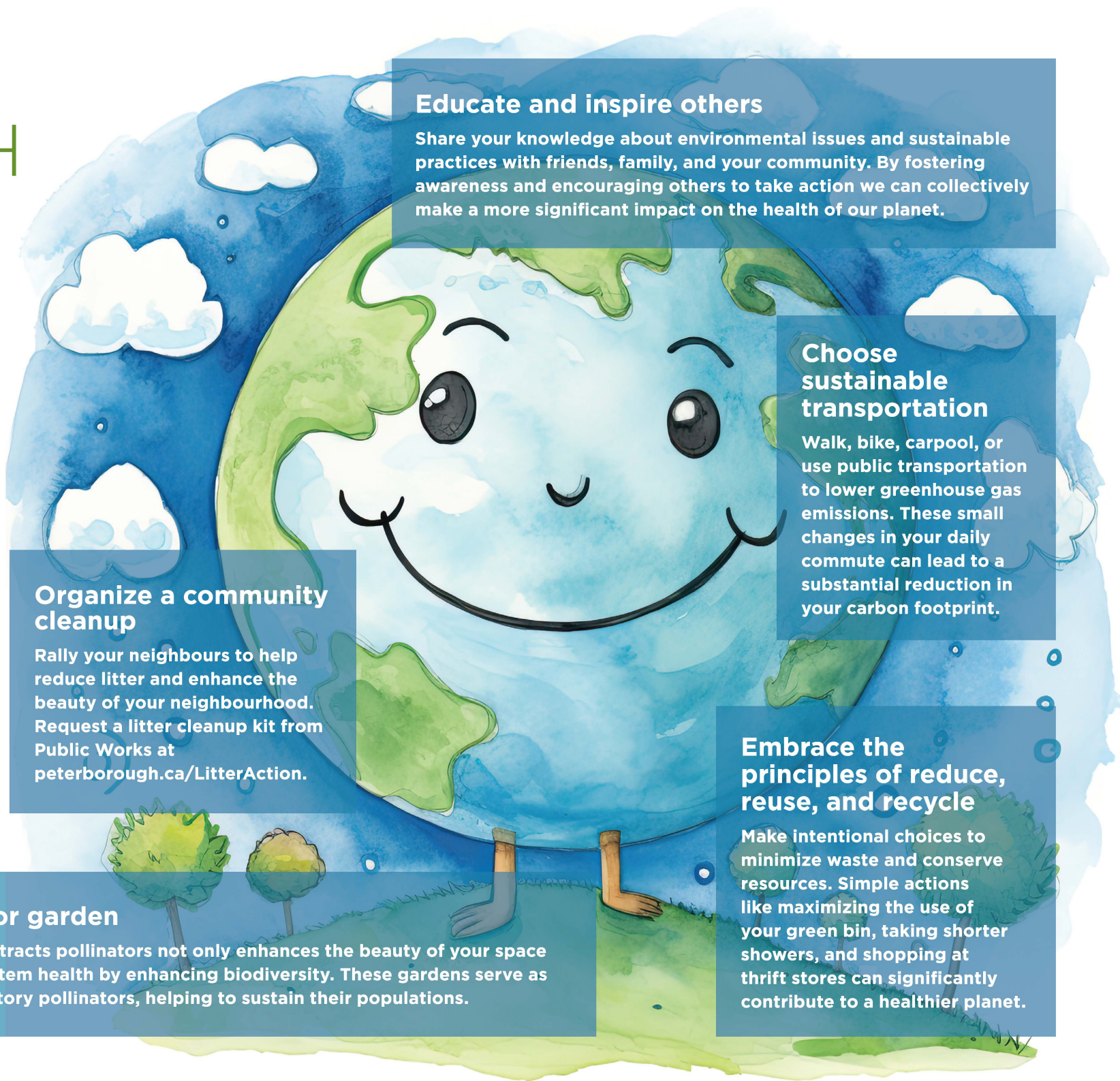



REUSABLE EXCHANGE WEEKENDS

Upcycle Your Treasures

Upcycling used items can breathe new life into things that might have gone to the garbage. By reusing and repurposing, just one household can divert hundreds of kilograms of waste from the landfill annually.

From May to September put unwanted items at the curb in the evening on the second Friday each month.

Take a walk through your neighbourhood to discover new treasures.

Bring unclaimed treasures brought back inside Sunday evening and save for the next exchange weekend.

Take unclaimed electronics to the Electronics Depot (no charge).

Take unwanted paint/stain to the Household Hazardous Waste Depot (no charge).

Take furniture and other durable goods to the Reuse Centre at the landfill.

Clothing

Thrifting from second-hand stores provides significant savings while contributing to eco-friendly practices and giving pre-loved garments a new life.

Upcycling old or found items is a great way to save money and reduce waste. Encouraging a circular economy positively impacts individuals and the planet.

Furniture

Discovering treasures during reusable exchange weekends promotes sustainability and community sharing.

Paint

Finding the perfect free paint that was safely disposed at the Household Hazardous Waste Depot helps reuse materials that might otherwise harm the environment.

KITCHEN FATS, OILS & GREASES

Disposable in your green bin

Fats, oils, and greases (FOGs) bind into a hard “fatberg” when they cool creating blockages and sewer back-ups into your home or the environment.

How to dispose of fats, oils & greases

Store FOGs until solid.

Scoop or wipe with paper towel and throw into your green bin.

Use paper towel to wipe greasy pots, pans, and utensils before washing. Don't use cloth towels; grease from your laundry still enters the sewer system, contributing to fatbergs.

Fats (solid at room temperature)

Butter or margarine, peanut butter, shortening or lard, dairy such as cheese and sour cream.

Oils (liquid at room temperature)

Cooking oils, salad dressings, and mayonnaise.

Greases (liquid, solidifies when cool)

Pet Waste is Safe for the Green Bin


















You can safely dispose of pet feces, cat litter, wood or paper bedding, feathers, fur, wool, and hair in the green bin. Only compost that meets strict quality standards is permitted to leave the Peterborough Organics Facility. The GORE® composting system reaches high temperatures that eliminate harmful bacteria, viruses, and parasites in pet waste. Ensure bags are BPI-certified compostable.

ORGANIC WASTE

Tips for keeping your green bin clean and pest free.

TIP
01

Line your bin with cardboard, newspaper, yard waste bags, paper towels, or certified compostable bags bearing these logos:



TIP
02

Regularly clean your kitchen container and green bin using dish detergent or a mix of vinegar and baking soda. Sprinkle baking soda in your bin to minimize odours.



TIP
03

Add layers of newspaper or compostable bags between contents to avoid liquid from pooling.



TIP
04

Always place your green bin out for curbside collection weekly, even if it's not full. Keep the lock in the vertical 'locked' position for easy emptying by collection vehicles.

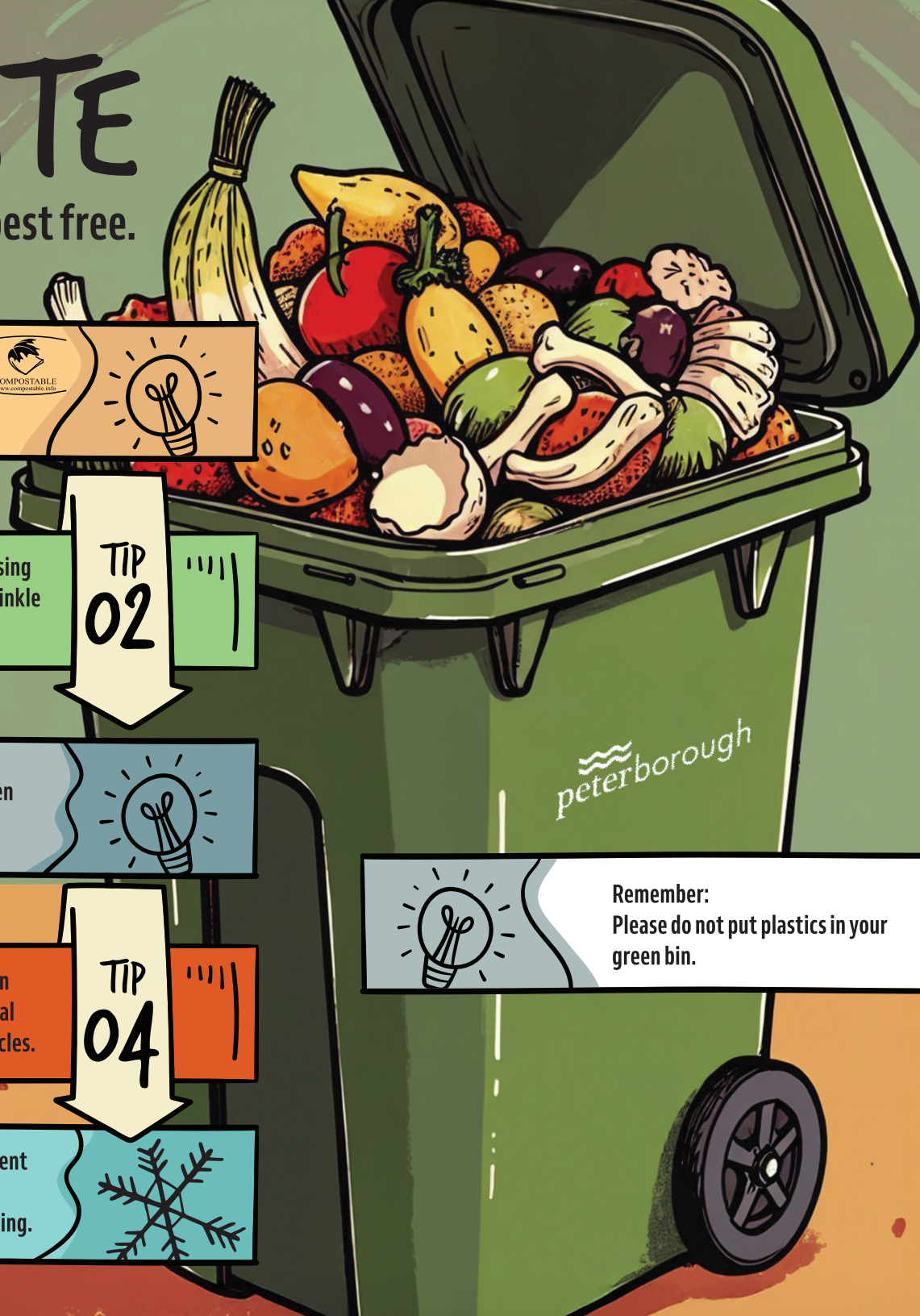


WINTER
TIPS

Store your bin in a sheltered area or sunny spot to prevent ice and snow buildup. Line the bottom of your bin with cardboard, egg cartons, or newspaper to prevent freezing.

Green Bin Collection

- On your collection day place your green bin at the curb no later than 7 a.m. with the lid in the locked position.
- Point the arrows on the green bin towards the street and the handles towards your home.
- Leave at least 2 feet clearance between your green bin and other items set out for collection.
- Do not overfill your green bin – fill loosely and lock lid.
- Do not use bungee cords or other items to keep your green bin closed.

Certified Compostable Bags Only

- Only certified compostable or acceptable paper bags can be used in green bins. Some bags will be labelled as biodegradable, but only bags with the either of these logos are certified compostable:



No Plastic or Glass in Green Bins

Remember that plastic and glass of any kind do not belong in the green bin. These materials contaminate the composting process and can lead to finished material that doesn't meet standards.

Tips to Reduce Moisture

- Put baking soda or shredded paper in the bottom of the container.
- Line with paper bags, newspaper, shredded paper, or paper towels.
- You can also line containers with an acceptable paper or certified compostable liner bag.

Leave the Green Bin When You Move

The green bin belongs to the residential address, please do not take it if you move. It is the property owner's responsibility to look after the green bin as well as ensure that it stays with the property.

Blue Bin Collection

- There is no limit on the number of blue boxes you may set out each week.
- Recycling must be at the curb by 7 a.m.
- Do not bag container items; place container products loose inside your blue box.
- Rinse off any excess food.
- Use one bin for containers and one bin for paper/fibre.
- Never put loose batteries in your blue box; take them to the Household Hazardous Waste Depot.

Accepted

Cardboard & Boxboard

Pizza boxes, moving boxes, shoe boxes, cereal boxes, tissue boxes, egg cartons, rolls from toilet paper and paper towel. Flatten to maximum 60 x 60 cm.

Paper

Flour bags, prescription bags, paper produce bags, notepads, loose paper, file folders, newspapers, brochures, magazines, greeting cards and envelopes, gift boxes, and shredded paper in tied clear plastic bags.

Paper Laminate Packaging

Pet food bags, food service bags, plates, spiral cans, cookie dough packages, ice cream containers, beverage cups with lids removed.

Cartons

Beverage, juice, milk, coffee creamer, soup and sauce cartons with lids on, sugar cartons.

Plastic

Laundry detergent, dish soap, and household cleaner bottles, shampoo and mouthwash bottles, salad dressing and condiment bottles, dish soap, plastic beverage bottles with lids on. Toothpaste tubes, hand cream tubes. Small item packaging including deodorant and hand sanitizer bottles, and plant pots.

Flexible Plastic Packaging

Dry cleaning, bread, newspaper and flyer bags, and paper towel toilet paper, and beverage containers overwrap. Coffee bags, deli pouches, chip bags, bubble wrap, snack wrappers, cereal liner bags, plastic gift bags.

Foam Packaging

Empty with film wrap and absorbent pads removed: meat trays, takeout containers, cups, plates, bowls, foam packaging.

Metal

Food cans, metal lids, cookie/coffee/tea tins, beverage cans.

Aluminum

Balled up aluminum foil, pie plates, and frozen food trays.

Aerosol Containers

Empty food spray, hairspray, air fresheners, shaving cream, deodorant can with lids removed.

Glass

Clear and coloured glass, food containers/jars/bottles, cosmetic containers, spice bottles, oil and vinegar bottles, and non-alcoholic glass beverage containers emptied with lids removed.

Recycling Program

Peterborough's blue box recycling program is now managed by Circular Materials, administrator of the common collection system and a not-for-profit organization committed to building efficient and effective recycling systems in Ontario.

GARBAGE

Garbage Collection

- Place up to four (4) clear garbage bags (no heavier than 30 lbs or 13.6 kg) at the curb by 7 a.m. on your collection day.
- No black, tinted, or white bags, or garbage cans.
- You may use up to three (3) small opaque privacy bags within each clear garbage bag.
- Individual items must be less than one metre or three feet in length; oversized items will not be collected.
- Remove uncollected garbage by 8 p.m. unless notice is provided of delayed service.

Clear Bags & Privacy Bags

Clear garbage bags must be used by both residential and commercial addresses. Clear bags protect garbage collectors from injury by helping them see sharp objects such as broken glass or needles, and they support waste diversion by discouraging recyclable or compostable materials and hazardous waste from being put in the garbage.

Not Collected

- Drywall, shingles, tile, bricks, lumber, tires and automotive parts. Take these to the Landfill.
- No hazardous waste. Take these to the Household Hazardous Waste Depot; used syringes/needles can also be returned to a pharmacy for safe disposal.
- TVs, computers, and other electronics should be taken to the Electronics Depot.

Unlimited Yard Waste Pick-up

Collection: first week of April to end of November.

- City By-Law prohibits the raking of loose leaves, branches, shrubs, or any other yard waste onto City streets and boulevards.
- Please do not place yard waste in your green bin.

Container Types

- Maximum weight 30 lbs (13.6 kg) each.
- Paper yard waste bags only, no plastic bags.
- Rigid open-top container (maximum volume 80L) with two fixed handles with a YARD WASTE label
- Yard Waste labels are available for free from City Hall, GreenUP, Home Hardware (Simcoe Street or Lansdowne Street locations).
- Lids must be removable and not secured by any means (bungee cords, etc.).
- Yard waste material must empty freely when dumped by the Collector.

Accepted

- Brush, branches, hedge/ tree trimmings tied in bundles up to 1 m (3') in length and 30 cm (12") in diameter weighing <30 lbs (13.6 kg).
- Grass clippings, leaves, plants, trimmings.
- Small amounts of sod within weight limit.

Not Accepted

- Stones, stumps, soil, large quantities of sod with soil.
- Driveway sweepings.
- Brush over the maximum dimensions.





Household Hazardous Waste Depot

The depot accepts most hazardous products and electronics free of charge. This service is for residential household and small businesses only; commercial waste is not accepted. **Never mix substances;** keep materials in their original containers when possible. Securely pack them in your vehicle to prevent spills.

Batteries

Batteries (including automotive) can be dropped off at the Hazardous Waste Depot and the Peterborough Public Library, Peterborough Sport & Wellness Centre, Miskin Law Community Centre, Healthy Planet Arena, and City Hall.

Accepted

- Paints, stains, oils, gasoline
- Cleaners, chemicals, pool chemicals, aerosols
- Propane tanks
- Pesticides, insecticides, herbicides
- Compact fluorescent lightbulbs (CFL)
- 4', 8' fluorescent light tubes
- Thermometers, thermostats
- Fire extinguishers
- Syringes, lancets
- Medicines, pharmaceuticals
- Computers, printers, monitors (no broken screens)
- Personal electronic devices, mobile phones
- DVD players, VCRs, fax machines
- Televisions (up to 52")
- Power tools and small appliances (no light bulbs)

Not Accepted

- Smoke detectors
- Pathological or radioactive waste
- Ammunitions, fireworks, explosives, flares

Sorted Waste Fees

Clear bag garbage is considered sorted but must not contain more than 10% divertible waste. Waste in opaque bags is considered unsorted.

Unsorted Waste Fees

Unsorted waste is defined as no intention to separate divertible waste streams from regular garbage. Divertible waste streams include, but are not limited to, recycling, organics (green bin household organics and/or leaf and yard waste), wood waste, scrap metal, tires, electronics, mattresses, and appliances.
