INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To Lesley Parnell

Report on the Financial Statement

I have audited the accompanying Financial Statement - Form 4 of the Campaign to Elect Lesley Parnell which includes the Statement of Campaign Income and Expenses for the period May 3, 2022 to December 31, 2022. The financial statement has been prepared by the Candidate based on the financial reporting provisions of the *Municipal Elections Act, 1996*.

Candidate's Responsibility for the Financial Statement

The Candidate is responsible for the preparation of this financial statement in accordance with the financial reporting provisions of the *Municipal Elections Act*, 1996 and for such internal control as the Candidate determines is necessary to enable the preparation of the financial statement that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

My responsibility is to express an opinion on this financial statement based upon my audit. I conducted my audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that I comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statement is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statement. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statement in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Campaign's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the Candidate, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statement.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained, including verifying Campaign contributions to the Campaign bank account, is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my qualified audit opinion.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

Due to the inherent nature of the transactions of organizations of this type, the completeness of the various categories of income and expenses is not susceptible to satisfactory audit verification. Accordingly, my verification of income and expenses was limited to the amounts recorded in the Campaign's records and I was not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to income and expenses from May 3, 2022 to December 31, 2022.

Qualified Opinion

In my opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, this financial statement presents fairly, in all material respects, the income and expenses of the Campaign to Elect Lesley Parnell from May 3, 2022 to December 31, 2022 in accordance with the financial reporting provisions of the *Municipal Elections Act, 1996*.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statement is prepared to assist the Campaign to Elect Lesley Parnell to comply with the financial reporting provisions of the *Municipal Elections Act*, 1996. As a result, the financial statement may not be suitable for other purposes. My report is intended solely for the use of the Campaign to Elect Lesley Parnell and the Ontario Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing, and should not be distributed to or used by parties other than the Campaign to Elect Lesley Parnell and the Ontario Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing.
